It was announced today that 2AM Group will be awarded the contract for technical operations management of the BMW North America Performance Center in Spartanburg, SC. The contract will involve the oversight and management of 24 positions all of which directly interact with the functionality of the BMW Performance Center technical and collision workshop operation management. This project award was announced by BMWNA today.

Business Communications Manager for BMW North America, Jan Ehlen says they announced to the employees yesterday the jobs that will be affected, and the contract will begin December 31, 2008. BMW North America runs the performance center, and they have hired a new service provider to run the day-to-day operation of the technical workshop and collision repair workshop.

The primary areas of 2AM’s interaction of services for the Performance Center will be; assisting in new vehicle delivery prep for customers, Import Car Processing campaign repair, BMW Associate pool car program maintenance and special vehicle issues for both BMW and Rolls Royce. These three areas will be primary areas for 2AM to identify increased performance opportunities and enhancements of productivity for the Center in vehicle turn time, mechanical, collision and paint repair.

Perry added, “Together with BMW we will work towards finding value added improvements and expand on the key performance indicators which drives their business, which is where 2AM operates at its best. In the current market and economic state, all parties involved in collective project management have to find ways to surpass former expectations to identify new levels of enhancement and proficiency. We are excited to be part of this challenge.”
